The [Fortinet Rack Mount Tray](#) is designed to allow you to rack mount Fortinet devices that are less than 1U wide. Supported devices are installed either directly onto the tray, or using the provided adapter bracket, and are held down with built-in [magnets](#) and, optionally, with the provided screws.

Devices with [plastic cases](#) must be screwed to the rack mount tray. See [Installation for Devices with Plastic Casings on page 9](#).

Devices with [metal cases](#) that are larger than 216x147.5mm are held to the tray with [magnets](#). Some devices can be screwed onto the tray to provide added security. See [Installation without the Adapter Bracket on page 8](#).

Devices with [metal cases](#) that are smaller than 216x147.5mm can be mounted using the [adapter bracket](#), and are held to both the bracket and the tray with [magnets](#). Some devices can be screwed into the adapter bracket and/or the tray to provide added security. See [Installation with the Adapter Bracket on page 6](#).

1 Installation with the Adapter Bracket

Note: Screwing the devices onto the mounting tray and into the adapter bracket is optional, but provides added security for your devices.

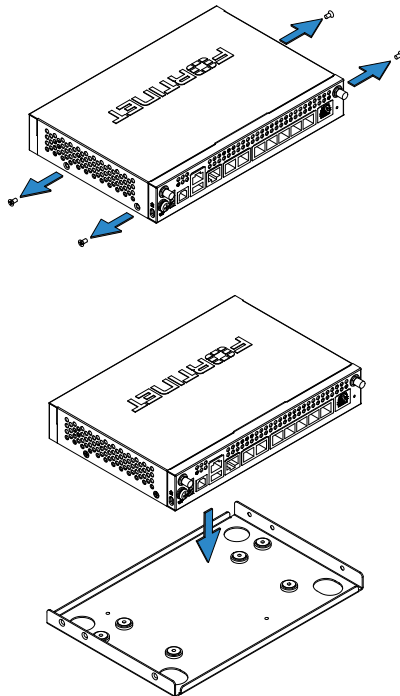
Prior to installing a device in the rack mount tray, ensure that the device is **powered off** and **disconnected** from the network.

The Kensington security slot is not available when the unit is placed in the adapter bracket.

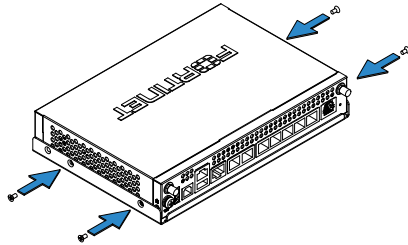
Devices larger than 216x147.5mm cannot use the adapter bracket.

To install a device using the adapter bracket

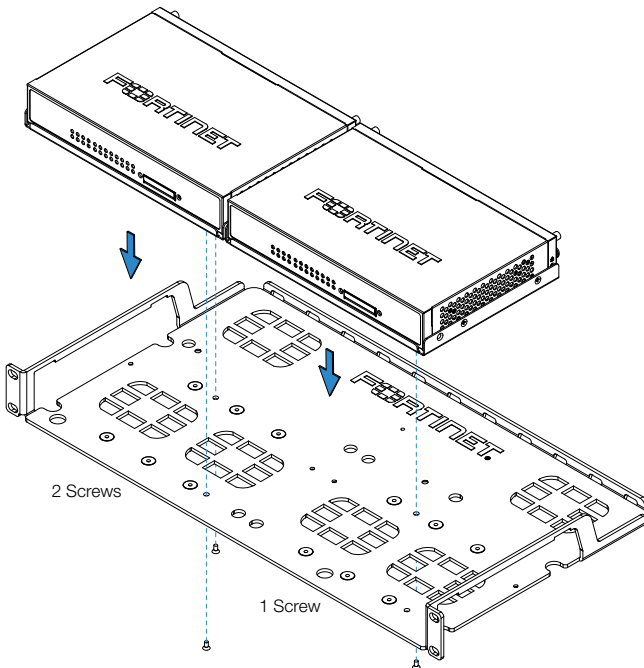
1. If applicable, remove the **four 4mm M3 screws** from the sides of unit.
2. Place the unit into the adapter bracket.



3. If applicable, use four of the provided **6mm M3 flathead screws** to secure the device into the bracket.



4. Place the bracket onto one side of the tray. The bracket is held in place with the magnets on the base of the bracket and on the rack mount tray.



5. Optionally, secure the bracket in place using one or two of the provided **6mm M3 flathead screws**.
6. Attach the provided **grounding wire** to the ground screw on the back of the unit and to the rack mount tray using the provided **6mm M3 panhead screw**.

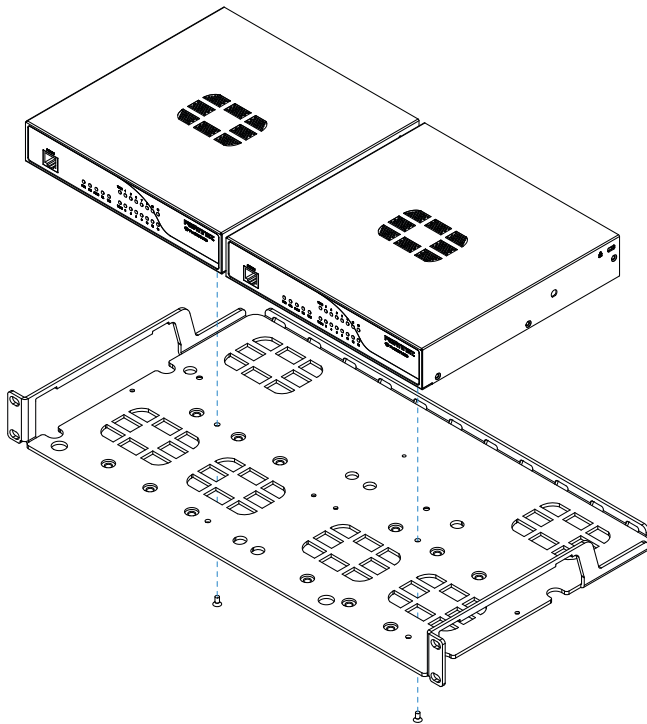
2 Installation without the Adapter Bracket

Note: Screwing the devices onto the mounting tray is optional, but provides added security for your devices.

Prior to installing a device in the rack mount tray, ensure that the device is **powered off** and **disconnected** from the network.

To install a device without using the adapter bracket

1. If they have been attached, remove the rubber feet from the bottom of the device.
2. Place the unit onto one side of the tray. The magnets in the tray will hold the device in place.
3. Optionally, secure the device in place using one or two of the provided **6mm M3 flathead screws**, depending on the number of screwholes on the bottom of the device that align to holes on the tray.



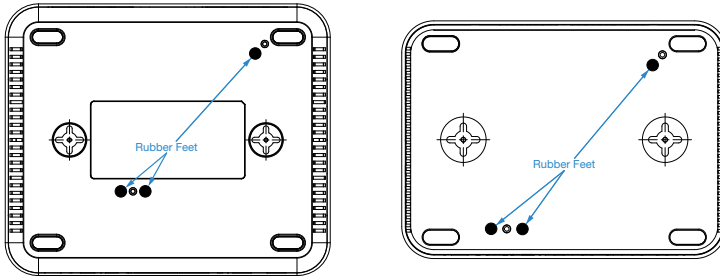
4. Attach the provided **grounding wire** to the ground screw on the back of the FortiGate unit and to the rack mount tray using the provided **6mm M3 panhead screw**.

3 Installation for Devices with Plastic Casings

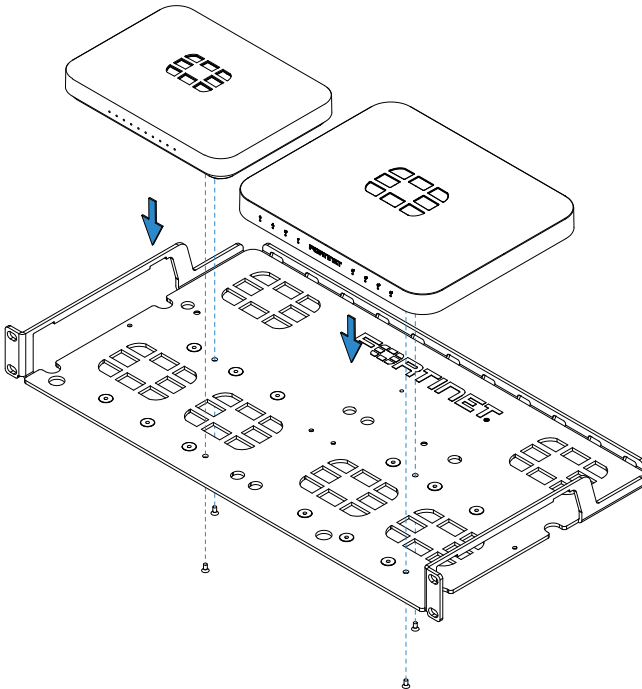
Devices with plastic casings must be secured to the tray using the provided screws.

To install a plastic device

1. Attach two **rubber feet** next to the center screw hole and one next to the corner screw hole.



2. Use two of the provided **8mm M3 flathead screws** to attach the unit directly to the rack mount tray.

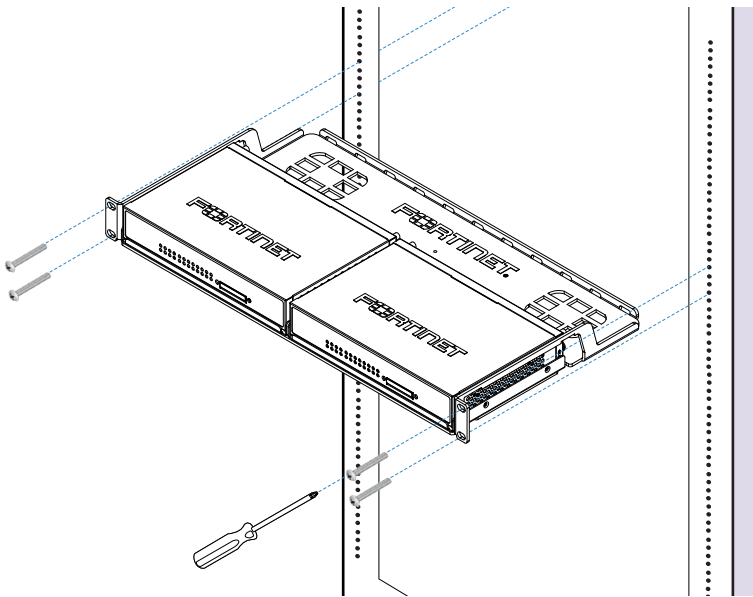


4 Installation of Tray into Rack

To install the rack mount tray into a rack

Caution: To avoid personal injury or damage to the unit, it is recommended that two or more people install the unit into the rack.

1. Position the rack mount tray in the rack. Ensure there is enough room around the unit to allow for sufficient [air flow](#).
2. Line up the rack mount tray holes to the holes on the rack and ensure that the Rack Mount Tray is [level](#).
3. Finger tighten four rack-mount screws to attach the unit to the rack.



4. Verify that the spacing around the rack mount tray conforms to requirements and that the unit is [level](#), then tighten the rack-mount screws with an appropriate screwdriver.
5. Connect the device to the network as per the device's [QuickStart guide](#). Device specific [QuickStart guides](#) can be found in the [Fortinet Document Library](http://docs.fortinet.com): <http://docs.fortinet.com>.
6. Secure the device's power adapters to the rack mount tray using the provided [cable ties](#).

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
